Kispayaks Territories

q̄isg. a'-st

I gw̄ya'mba (w̄ssam lake'

- ✓ ① The whole Skeena River c̄egunye' where spawns spring salmon "yc̄". About 20 miles frontage on the Skeena, and extending east by way of the Skeena to French Peak, including part of the Babine Trail.

Belonged to gw̄yamb̄s and nuxs; w̄ssam lake also had privilege of going there.

② k̄cenaxa'ndz̄t : to make snares. A hunting
territory about 10 x 10 miles, in a valley above the
Klapox R. Belonged exclusively to w̄ssam lake!

on Skeena just upstream of the bridge to
Hazelton.

④ Fishing station in Hazelgate canyon

xad̄m da'uks

- ✓ ⑤ Along Klapox, 2 small lakes : tam̄etq̄e'ldz̄n and
t̄am̄kcedz̄tsx̄ut "lake of black", and a trail to
the mountain near the Nass : wi·tax̄a'bask,
the northern part of which he uses. (q̄itwintuk in
southern)

II kwiyet

- ① A creek up the Kispiox River at First Cabin (Cullon Creek). A trail goes from this creek to the Skeena.
A fishing cabin also served as hunting lodge (groundhog)
- ② kcelug. al-a'gn a creek on the other side of the Kispiox L.
- ③ A territory on another creek 8 miles above ①, [Ironside Creek?] with two cabins:
ləphε'-it xut - name of territory, mountain,
by itself standing (and cabin)
huxsg. an mā'dst - a berry house.
Plenty bushes berries

Brown adds

- 6 x 20 miles on Kispiox
- mountain 15 x 20, 3 houses near təlgamug
- 10 x 2 on Skeena, r.h. side above Shesquia

III gitluda'tk (helakswełp)

- ① *lax'anda'fu* "on hunting ground", a territory enclosing Nine-mile Mtn. There was a hunting house ^{near} ~~near~~ the mountain (groundhog) and a fishing house directly across from Kispiox village called *kunwidzi'x* "like caribou" ~~the~~
- daxtet* "together tied" (two little lakes) on the r.h. side of the Kispiox going up. Fishing house.
- natat*, on other side of Kispiox. Fishing house. A trail leads from here to a mountain (over toward the Nass trail) *wicange'l* "along to the top" (groundhogs)

Brown - 15x6 on Kispiox R.

helakswełp

- ④ A territory west of the Kispiox, with a lake
- ⑤ Fishing station on Skeena, *kunwidzi'k* on Kispiox side
a little above ~~x~~ from Lax's place 5m above top.
below *gwiyembe*

l.a.n

Location? ① Fishing station on Skuna t's, txs "waterfall"

Location? ② Fishing station on Kispiox qal'sonzo-to-p "through hole in the rock"

Location? ③ Fishing station near ②, taix q'a'uxt "all flat" (the stones on the bottom).

A trail led to the mountain lax'an sawagoxs "where ^{other} maple bark"

g.alha'itən

✓ ① lax t'sda'x "by itself sitting", a large territory on the trail to the Nass, with a lake that drained into the Kispiox.
1° on this side of hillsides

'a'ləx

✓ ① In-andilgən "in beaver dam" a territory on Kispayaks. The Nass trail passed through this land and crossed the Kispiox here "at the head of the waterfalls". A bridge here, and a salmon house. They had a feast house here, into which they invited people coming over the Nass Trail.

Brown says 6x15 on Kispiox Hs 208

lilabaksku

- ① A territory almost to the Nass along the grease trail : *xse'mo'daksxut* "of milky appearance"
- ② Fishing station on Skeena ^{west side} *'anhal dom bi'ct*
"where torn up" (the roots of spruce) [This was
done to induce rain. The roots were torn out
and worn about a woman's head].
Location?
- ③ Fishing station, w. side, nr ② *mintanga'ldz*
"at the base of the thin flat rocks"
