
SOME HELPFUL HINTS

- Leave word with a friend, or the RCMP, where you will be travelling and when you expect to return.
- Carry an extra spare tire and a 4-gallon can of extra fuel. Only limited vehicle service facilities are available.
- Carry supplementary food rations on your trip.
- Respect the property of others
 please do not attempt to operate machinery which you might encounter. Our employees' livelihoods depend on this equipment.
- Keep track of your speedometer mileage so you can locate your whereabouts on the road map.
- Carry a pocket compass and know your directions if hiking. Be out of the woods before dark.

The forests you will be travelling through provide work for many people and support sawmills at Terrace and Kitwanga plus two pulpmills at Prince Rupert. They are managed and protected to ensure the continuing prosperity of this northern area.

These managed forests offer a scenic setting for many recreational activities. Twinriver Timber Limited, the managers of these forests, believe that these recreational activities can be served with mutual co-operation of all concerned.

Within the forests the Company has constructed many miles of roads providing access to these scenic areas and the North. These forests contain very extensive stands of over-mature decadent timber suitable only for pulp manufacture. This timber is removed in clear cut patches and immediately reforested to re-establish future forest crops and recreational use.

Twinriver Timber Limited is pleased to provide access to the North and to the recreational areas within these managed forests but is very concerned about your safety and the well-being of its employees. Travelling on logging roads during working hours exposes you to extreme hazards and the possibility of a serious accident. Please restrict your travel to authorized hours of use and observe all regulations to help make your trip a safe one.

but please follow these rules

DO NOT USE PRIVATE ROADS DURING WORKING HOURS

Use is normally permitted on Saturday, Sunday and Holidays or between 5:30 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. on working days. These restrictions are for your safety as logging trucks operating on narrow dusty gravel roads create extremely hazardous driving conditions.

Do not exceed posted speeds. Roads may be closed during periods of high fire hazard.

• DO DRIVE WITH YOUR HEADLIGHTS ON

Safe driving on narrow winding dusty roads is helped by the use of headlights at all times.

• DO GIVE RIGHT-OF-WAY TO LOGGING TRAFFIC

Pull over and stop well in the clear. Proceed only when safe to do so.

• DO USE EXTREME CAUTION WHEN PASSING

Do not pass a moving vehicle unless you are sure of clear visibility and ample passing space. If being overtaken, assist the other driver by slowing down and pulling over.

• DO CONSIDER THE SAFETY OF OTHERS

Do not hunt or shoot in any active logging area, employees may be working at other than normal times.

• DO PARK YOUR VEHICLE OFF THE ROAD

Wide loads or emergency traffic may have to get by - keep the road clear.



DO PREVENT FOREST FIRES . . . KEEP YOUR FORESTS GREEN

Help protect our forests, the greatest source of livelihood for the people of British Columbia.

- Do not light fires in the woods.
- Do not throw cigarettes out of your windows USE THE ASHTRAY.

DO OVERNIGHT CAMP IN AUTHORIZED AREAS ONLY

Public campsites are shown on the map. Please plan your camping activities to utilize these sites.

- Do not smoke while walking stop for your smoke in a safe place and assure that the cigarette butt and matches are properly extinguished.
- Do report any fires immediately to the nearest Forest Ranger or Company employee.

DO NOT LITTER

Help keep litter, bottles and garbage out of the woods.
