

Chaatl sometimes called "Old Gold Hbr."

1835 Work diary May 10 Cowwith which live a little farther up the sound (from Skidegate) also Cowelth.

183 - Work census Kow-welth 35h 561.

1851 Work Journal May 18 out Skidegate narrows, stopped at Kihkai'ti Village <sup>"near the outlet of the strait."</sup>, abandoned exc 2 farms, many houses decayed. Visited Kihkai'ti on way back from Gold Hbr. (under chiefs name Kils La-i of Swanton p. 270 R10a) [no doubt Chaatl, but ident of name doubtful]

Ref to Ingraham?: "The most Southern entrance into this Sound near the gold appears amply roomy for a vessel to enter... A ship had been in this passage several many years ago."

Łgā'xet is in name of both E8 and L9 clans, from old town or Skidegate <sup>Little Town</sup> from which they both moved to Chaatl.

Tegā'it of Bone. p24 (Jawem Skai-to?)

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Swanton: (Handbook p 87) Old people recall the names of 28 houses, but many more are said to have existed before a great fire which destroyed a large part of the town. In later times the people moved to New Gold Hbr

1791 Ingraham Mayer Sound

183 - Work census Kish-a-win 18h 329

1851 Work Journal May 22 stopped at Cassiwana village  
May 25, camped at well on way back. Indo in temper.  
South entrance to this sound roony "A ship had  
been in this passage repairing many years ago".  
[Ingraham?]

Swanton (Handbook p 233) - long ago occ by Kas-lanas later settled by Kaiahl-  
lanas E9 from Skidegate Inlet. Sometimes called Old Gold Hbr  
but that name is properly applicable to Skaito a camp on Gold  
Hbr where Hades lived during gold excitement. Old people  
remember 17 Huses.

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
