Please find herewith a copy of a document sent to the Nishga Tribal Council, from the Kitwancool HIGH CHIEFS, dated December 12, 1968, A.D. this document was signed by High Chiefs GWAS-LAM (Abel Campbell) and SIN-DIL; the Xhief Councillor did also sign it namely Edgar Good, Lawrence Williams and Vince Gogag; a copy of same was also mailed to the Indian Office, Hazel I am sending this copy to you to show my Hazelton, B.C. constant efforts to retain our HIGH REGARDS of THE NISHGA TRIBAL COUNCIL and also to retain order and good faith between the Kitwancool and the Nishga people; in my meeting with the Nishga Tribal Council. in the presence of Mr. Tom Berger, in the Empress Hotel, Victoria, B.C. November 1968, A.D. I told them, with due respect, that the Kitwancool did not want to deal with the matter contained in the document refered to above, openly while their case was before the courts in B.C. knowing that they need all ligitimat help and protection; and when they appeal the case to the supreme Court of Canada, I again avoid any intervention that might hurt council The Nishga Tribal although their overlapping land claims on the Kitwancool territory is no small matter in view of the HIGH HONOUR and DIGNITY of the HEREDITY CHIEFS of The NISHGA and also THE HIGH HONOUR AND DIGNITY OF THE HEREDITARY CHIEFS OF KITWANCOOL.

Sir, Further reason for mailing to you a copy of the document mentioned above which was sent to The NISHGA TRIBAL COUNCIL is, that the Federal Government is willing to negotiate with the Indians of B.C. with a view to settle the B.C. Indian land claims of various tribes or organizations; during the expected negotiation, everyone must not stimulate or stir up any conflicting action; in this way all THE HIGH HONOUR OF EVERYONE OF THE HEREDITY CHIEFS IN THIS Province will come out, after satisfactory settlement ,intact, Encl.
