Swanson, 1915.

House names: the houses of royal chiefs had names, but it was not common for *lekałiget* to own house names.
(gave 2 examples from q. *lodza*; 2 chief and 1 *ləkak-*)

Dog Names

All royal q. spw. houses may use *məs'ə'lə* and *madik* as dog names.

People having female *naxnəx* apply these names to their dogs.

Canoe names: Canoes occasionally had names, but it was not general.

(Gave 2 examples: Grizzly canoe & Octopus canoe, *nistknimik*)

acquired by proclaiming in a feast

1. *lənəmge'it*
2. *mɛsəb̥axs*
3. *medičk* and *semi* medičk of sea and hills
4. *Mirage* (2 gisp forms)
5. *txatkuñe'ex* 2 having same name, different forms
6. Thunderbird : *əsawz'-q̥st* (different forms)

Mixing crests on a totem pole
Mrs Campbell to Beynon. 1916

It was not the custom of the Tsimshian, as it was of the Haida, to show the crests of yourself and your wife on the same pole.

If they wanted to, however, they could erect a pole to show from whence they came by showing their own and their father's crests. It would cost a lot to do, and would not be held of importance.

Such a pole would be termed

Done by a qibata man when she was about 16.

She is only one here (Simpson) with tattoos.

Martha Wesley wa'ne'ga at Essington
also is tattooed.
