

## Information on Edensaw family

### From CFN Notes

CE's mother - Joan Hobson of the Naskunpeople erected at Skedgate a monument (beaver at bottom, then raven & toadstool, Eagle at top) in honor of her wife Klakona of the Nastas Eagles. She came from Masset & was the mother of CE and sister of Henry Edensaw's father. (CFN notes ex Ch Jefferson on Skedgate houses)

P Kelly 1965 confirmed CE's mo was wife of JK (PK's gt. uncle). She had been wife of uncle of J Hobson, JK inherited her with name.

AEE "Old Edensaw was recognized as chief of the whole Haida nation. He married a Kacan woman and by her had one son, the present Henry Edensaw. By a previous marriage had one son who died."

(AEE) Had 2 nephews, one of whom married Eliza ans widow (Henry's mother). These two went round with Swan in 1883. (CFN 1897 Notes, Vol 2)

Mrs CE Mrs E belonged to Edwin Scott's family  $\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $\frac{8}{2}$  to Masset.

1902 Chief's name q̄̄s̄t̄wak (CFN 1902 notes Kacan)

1902 notebook: Coddle 7944. Used by Mrs Edensaw, maker, who belongs to chief's family at Skunkwan, who lives in a house called q̄̄s̄t̄wak.

AEE Masset. "HE says the Weah beavers pole stood inside the old house as far back as he can remember. He and his father lived with old Weah for some years when they first came to Masset from Kungh, to wh. place they had previously moved from Kustas." (CFN 1901 Journal)

July 5 Kungh: made a path to old Edensaw's house -- examined inside pole, which has lost its [book ?].

CFN 1902 Kasaan collected set of models of fox traps as used at Hetta, Alaska (79682) from Solomon Edensaw, old E's son.

also in notes:

accession 823 Doctor Rattle

"... made by Solomon Gwegwan' /in, son of the last Edensaw." copy of one used by his uncle Ha ka/i a well known doctor of Kunsta, who is buried at Kunsta.

AEE's uncle (CFN Notes on house building from CE, 1902)

"at <sup>the</sup> end on old Edensaw's uncle lived who as a boy saw Douglas. his uncle's name was Kunia"

Chief's house at Hallett 58' wide, 60 deep. Totem 42'

1902 Notes on CE's model totem

Pole erected by AEE's uncle, who succeeded Kunia as chief <sup>uncle</sup> at Dadens [Kunsta]

Sqilao was no 3's uncle [<sup>ac</sup> uncle of AEE's uncle?], town chief at Hallett where there were 7 houses

Original made by a Chaath or Kauuu carver who died before AEE was born, who also worked at Skid and Kunsta.
