stand; I am also told that the person did phone to the Berger firm in
Vancouver (the Nishga Lawyer firm) for the purpose above mentioned; if possible,
you have the authority to enquire.

I am also told that the school teacher who marry on e Solomon Marsden's son
is trying to obtain peices of land at the Kitwancool lake through land
offices of B.C. and that they also trying to get you to help them; if this
is true, they don't have to go to the B.C. Land office to get the lands
desired because the Kitwancool own the Kitwancool territory but the Marsdens
must not occupy any land that belongs to the WOLF CLAN bncause the Marsdens are
FROGS and they could rightfully occupy any peice of land that belongs to
the FROG CLAN which is on the South west side of the Kitwabncool Lake
and not the Northeast side of the lake; trouble could come up when the
Government settles the Kitwancool land claim if ~~eitherone~~ ^{eitherone} of the CLANS
does occupy another's land or territory.

This is got unusual in the worl so you and myself, in our possition, cannot be
confused and hold on calmly.
