The village of York was founded by a tribe who were harassed by the Tsimshians, that they had to leave forever the homes of their childhood and of forefathers, and seek a more congenial home with Edensaw's tribe in the far North. On the point opposite North Island, about a mile from Edensaw's ~~old~~ <sup>MUSEUM OF AMERICAN INDIANS</sup> wall of Kiowata,  
— and for protection they dug a ditch from sea to sea, inside of which they small a palisade - - now nothing remains but this crumbling houses and their mummied decaying in boxes in their Suthlingun.  
Edensaw said first all the children died, then one by one through the passing years the old folks died, until kindly hands built the suthling-un over the last.
