Tradition of tsantik crest (squirrel), house of
te'walašu, laxskik, gitwanḡ.

Semediš, 1923.

Some people had a fish weir (t'̄n) and smoke house ~~near~~ at laxkunsḡ.x near gitlaxdams on the Nass. Some ^a big ^{white} squirrels "just the size of bears" ~~was~~ seen running across the weir. Frightened, the people left the camp. Two women, kstiȳḡ.m̄.w̄. and lu-sag.e'tuxs came to gitang. et ^{new home camp.} One of them brought the halaidamske:k "hat of eagle". Both had children here.

Later, they heard that all of their people on the Nass had been destroyed by plague, and they went back to gitlaxdams and raised large families there to fill the places of those who had died.

These women had been laxskik on the Nass, and they were adopted into the laxskik at gitanget. That is why we use the squirrel crest.
