How The Indians Got Their Share of Lands

- 1. At low ebb of population
- 2. On false premises:
 -that they were dying out
 -that they were becoming white men
- 3. On understanding that their old rights would continue. outside of reserves.
- 4. On spurious basis of "acres".
- 5. At a time of evanescent industries (dogfish oil, fur seal).
- 6. Hastily, without examination of principles, implications, or due care (got only some of old village sites)
- 7. On policy decisions made elsewhere in other circumstances.
- 8. Without consultation of principles.
- 9. Receive limited rights: not owners, no mineral rights, foreshores, etc.
- 10. There were fierce reductions under Trutch, reversals of original Douglas policy.
- 11. OC 1036 hedged with conditions.

12. Without rights to pre-emption of outside lands for a long time.
