p. 101 Tills of liberating boar & 2 sows at "Mager's Sound"; W. C. Moresby Is. July 7, 1791.

p. 124 Mentioned Koyaks
but went toward Meaks

125 Meak July 31

Aug 2, 1791 Koyak visited him in (Skincuttle?)

127 "... he said he had seen Capn Kendrick... (Washington)

Went north, met Kanskenei. They were gone later in Aug 30
a summer village.

Aug 27 1791 - At Cumshewa Inlet

p. 150 ... about noon we saw 12 large war canoes crossing
the entrance of the sound the Indians on board said
they were Koyak and Kill 'hi' vents going to fight
Sheetkree --- Watched them - they did go on to Skridgate

Sailed on 29th It looked as though the locals were
preparing to attack - uneasy - he left

At Meaks, the few Indians seemed scared "from which
p. 154 I concluded some vessel had fired on them - - -
Aug 31 but told that the ~~other~~ men were all gone to war,
that Koyah and Kilkinants had join'd their forces and
gone to attack Skeethiss - (confirming what was told in
Cumshewa Tabet.

p. 159 Mentions "... the natives chew a plant (as many say
as do Tobacco) ... it appear'd to me to possess some
of the properties of Tobacco I have procur'd a good
quantity of the seeds and shall send them home for
investigation. - - -

p. 167 Vocabulary - lists chiefs incl. Koyah Kil-kin-nants
Yacah Kleeu

p. 191 Dec. 7 1791 in China

"in the evening arrived the Brig Washington- Capⁿ John Kendrick He had been engaged in a very disagreeable Skirmish with the Natives . . . who Koyah is the chief - -

"on his last voyage" had put the chief in irons

Kendrick let "about 50 of the natives get on board his vessel while there remain'd above twice that number was alongside . .

p. 192 the keys of the arm chest which stood on the quarter were missing on which Cap Kendrick challenged the natives with the theft . . . Koyah and sev others leaped on top of the chest - Koyah said you cant get arms to kill us now "holding out his leg saying now put me in irons"

Yuah and Sculkinants also aboard, tried to trade, but K. stood his guard with a bar of iron. Natives hailed for more canoes, didnt let any seamen go below, prepared daggers. Kendrick told his men to drop below one at a time and prepare arms in cabin - 4 muskets, ab blunderbuss, and a pair of pistols - Koyah, suspecting, sprang down into the Cabin & K. jumped on his back. Seeing muskets, Koyah retreated, K & men came up shouting and firing, cleared decks, arms chest, "kill'd about 30 of the natives leaving others to lament their folly"

July 18 1792

Coming south along east side - met a canoe with Koyah and a few others "I could not entice Koyah on board ... [promises and persuasions] awakened his suspicions - - - "had a guilty down look and I believe he sincerely repents his attempt to take Capⁿ Kendrick"

July 21 At Cumshewa talking to Chief Skatzi

p. 217

"... as the topic was on the carpet I ask'd how many of Koyah's tribe fell in their encounter with Capⁿ Kendrick they ans'd 40 among which were severall women and Children Koyah they said was wounded in the back and lost in the battle a wife and 2 Children 2 of his Brothers were likewise badly wounded - Sculkinants was wounded in the left cheek and the ball lodged under his ear which they could not extract till lately"

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
