

## Laxkiba

See asayal yen and anaxlede. (glacis)

Laxkiba are mediak but have to designate it semi'.  
These use the semi'.

- 1 n̄islayano's had it originally
- 2 n̄istelex originally had it, original owner of wilx medm semi'. He would not let others use this name, they had to call it wil he'it kat semi' "where stood the bear".
- 3 ?anaxlede
- 4 gitlaxe' (gitlodza) owned it originally.
- 5 1ε°;is " He got it from anaxlede. It was made (by?) anaxlede at kspe ke'mepa (at gitxata) from which house 1ε°;is was subdivided
- 6 t̄ibaks (gitxata) original
- 7 txɔ'gət (gitxatalasəz) " owned it
- 8 x̄ne's (ḡapaxl̄ts) "
- 9 n̄iske
- 10 n̄isma'nts (gitzaxtet)

## Origin of Taxkibū houses.

Abstr. Narr. How the Taxkibū Houses among the Tsimshian originated.  
Wallace to Bryson, 1915.

The Taxskik village of ni-swa'amak was opposite the village of the Taxkibū', and between the two villages was a seal trap belonging to the Taxkibū. In order to get possession of the trap ni-swa'amak and the Taxskik made war on the Taxkibū' and killed them all. [? in below]

The wife of ni-swa'amak was a Taxkibū' woman, and he did not want her to have male children who might grow up and take revenge on him.

After this battle all the people of the Taxkibū house of asag.alye'n scattered to different places. Upon returning once more to Nitlakatla, asag.alye'n returned to his former tribe [gitsi's], la'is joined the gitludza'u's, 'ntade returned to his former tribe the gitsi's, and ~~ni-sk̓e'~~ ni-sk̓e' moved to the gitzaxte't

La'is, a descendant of the house of 'ntade', went to the gitludza'u's because he wanted to join that tribe and he had the wealth to do so. In former times a person could join another tribe if he had relatives there (i.e. people of the same phratry), and if he could expend a large amount of wealth among the tribe he wished to join.

ni-sk̓e' joined the gitzaxte't in the same manner.

These four houses (asag.alye'n, 'ntade, la'is, and ni-sk̓e') have the same child names and crests.

# Lax̄k̄ibn (general)

gitwilgots : ḡwus̄'aw̄e'l house After the flood he came over from Alaska, from Stikine. Most of the Lax̄k̄ibn are of northern origin, either st'ikine, tsilq̄at (Chilkat), taḡ (Taku). From Taku came n̄isslayano's (gitlən) He came by himself from Alaska, not connected with gwankuit.

Crests. 1° ḡwus̄'aw̄e'l : robe full of arrows, he took his name from it. Has no relatives here.

ḡinad̄iks : n̄istəl̄-ex he is connected with house of n̄isslayano's, having originated from the house of n̄isslayano's; they were not blood relatives. Have the same names in the two houses and same crests. Came from same place, taḡ (Taku)

Crest of n̄isslayano's : wāne'ne-xt : robe full of teeth teeth of blackfish of a small variety of blackfish, not ḡisparw. one.

: set̄san xp̄il̄sp is of the same origin as set̄san : ḡinad̄iks originally.

gitlən : tə'təm̄l̄-a'x originated from taḡ as they mention in their myth having passed through the same ice passage as n̄isslayano's. Has rel. here.

ḡinayanḡik : kwicaw̄e'l

git̄sīs : asayal̄gen group, They must originally have come from the Skuna and gone to Alaska and returned again, as asayal̄gen was not known at first, as that name was adopted at metlakatla. origin? not nege.
