Wright: (Gave myth of sasaaxt coming from $t'om lax'a'm$)

He brought with him the following crests:

1. medisk : grizzly bear decorated with pearls

(There is some trouble over this house with gitxa'xa gisp.)

Sasaaxt uses these crests with the general crests of the gispow.

Wallace: gitwalgits and gitxat a have special names for this next crest. sasaaxt call her kəmas'nε'xt (the next in myth of duckskin garment and one that ran away from gunaxnisonget).

* Wright to Bay. This was a long house and was two houses joined together. It was built by iyahwən a grandfather of sasaaxt. Tsibas built a house of this pattern and there was trouble as to who had direct ownership over this type of house; sasaaxt not being a wek'at to tsibas' and only a wi'lā'ist, tsibas claimed that sasaaxt had no right to it. They tried to settle it between themselves by breaking coppers but this brought no settlement. As it was assumed by both, git'saxtökwe'lp in itself implies that the house was so long that people in a feast were ashamed to walk the length of it to their seats and show themselves to all the people.

II House of 1yo'sans

(Tavskii-k)

Wright: From laxhaida he brought the following crests

1. xskik : eagle, used as a headdress. the general crest of all tavskiks.
2. tpuan we-lp "whale house" which is the house of 1yo'sans and of lug-s-l.

Moffat: xskilak was his crest, with other tavskii-k. It was on their garments, poles, etc.

- Wright:
1. haitkam st'sa-l (standing beaver) in the same manner as sagwets. Both had same name for it ^{beaver}eagle
 2. xskik as a headdress, on his robe, he had representation of whole eagle
 3. tpu'-nom we-lp was the name of his house 'whale house'; the whales were represented on the front of the house. The same crest, whale, as a dzepk also belongs to lug-s-l and halitkwa

III House of Ta'dax (ganhada)

Wright: (origin) He brought with him the following crests:

1. tɔt̓kəm̓g̊ex ^{raven} "raven split in the centre". A robe with the representation of the raven split in the centre used when giving an iya'uk and also painted on the front portion of his house. Not on poles.
2. qawəg̊.ε'it a la'nəm̓gait a headdress made of the roots of spruce, made in 5 parts one on top of the other. It is made of wood when used on top of poles.
3. hä'gwalds̓.ləm maksit̓k : headdress made of white weasel, used in battle and potlatch.
4. ta'ax an underground house made and brought from Bella Bella. ('taat ta'ax and kwäg̊.ε'it (2) go together in a myth)
5. g.ε'.yəm pt̓s̓en ^{raven pole} "Raven totem" a long pole with a raven on the end

These are the exclusive crests of the royal ganhada group of the gitwilg̓its.

Moffat: (a) ^{frog} g̊an̓a'o was their main crest. Hat made of wood, frog represented on it, paws, eyes, ears, teeth, decorated with pearl. B. used in wealth potlatches. This crest was used by other ganhada, e.g. ts̓is̓ etc., in same manner.

(b) ^{raven} g.ε'.x in olden days they used elk skin garment, and painted the raven on it. Also painted on house front, as was frog. Also used by other ganhada.

Wright: 1. kwäg̊.ε'it a lanəm̓g̊.ε'it of 5 parts, used on top of poles (wood). Exclusive to him (perhaps also n̓is̓h̓at̓)
2. tɔt̓kəm̓g̊ex (see above) also in house of ni̓sh̓at̓.

IV House of hal̓itkwa' (laxskisk)

Wallace: Drawing of Beaver used by liest̕sm̕g̕m̕lax̕e'
lug̕z̕l, x̕a̕ig̕et, hal̓itkwa'. An eagle crest.

V House of wutsi'nt (gispawndwads)

Wright: use the crests adopted by the gispawndwads of the nuguuak's.

Mrs Emma Musgrave: (as part of nuguuak's myth of wutsi'nt)

She heard these crests mentioned at an iya'ok

- This myth is the same as the gi'dstsu' nuguuak's myth except that it is located at kws'k mountain, and the men in the canoës are wutsi'nt and dragon spirit of this house
1. k'le'n (special type of seaweed) used as decoration inside house and was represented in wood hanging from the beams of the house.
 2. gane'ts - starfish which was seen in the house of the monster that took them down at kws'k. Used in same manner as 1, never on poles or robes or paintings. And it had no reference to the ganhad's gane'ts (ganhada didn't object to its use as it was in their myth).
 3. txatkunε'xs "fins all around, blackfish" claimed as exclusive of this house, also represented by the gi'dstsu' group as their exclusive crest. It was a blackfish with fins all around its body and was painted on robes used in naming ceremonies, also on house front, also on poles.
 4. gusdaya'a'o robe of daya'a'o (seaweed) made of this kind of seaweed and used in naming ceremony

Moffat: (a) gwuste'its a garment representing a kind of seaweed painted on the garment, yellow. Only on the garment. Used in potlatches and on changing of names. Exclusive to this house All the family may use it He has other crests of the gispawndwade no gitw.lgots has the ske'məm.

Fabre: Crests of both V and VIII (ni'somage')

- (1) ne'gəm sag'slak fin on scalp headdress
- (2) gdzaxtök' we'lə "broken in two house" It was given to saxsa'xt by tsayamε'gisk. tsayam and wutsi'nt were the same man at the time! This is a crest acquired at the gitnaguuak's from the sea.

(3) *gi·e b̄z̄ lkt* painted on housefront, exactly like a large eagle.

(4) *ʔne·xt* or *pε·t kəm ʔne·xt* split blackfish

house painting, ordinary blackfish, it had human beings on its back.

(5) *kwus t̄ε·its* garment of seaweed

(6) *Kwus t̄aq̄a'·o* " " sea animals
(reddish animal seen on rocks at low tide)

(7) *l̄ayax'we'·s*

(8) *mεs̄ b̄axs* (red leggings) got them at getna.
gunaks with the galkmate

(9) *qahām̄z̄xk* "backbone of the blackfish" represented as alive; exclusive to him.

(10) *miye'·isqan* two human beings which were standing at each corner of the house, originally from *gitnaguṇaks*. Exclusive.

Wright: (1) pt'sε'nm gaye't a pole with gayet at bottom looking down. Raven perched on top, and the starfish gam'a'o under the raven, and game'ts under (a 5 branched small star).

This was not erected here at any time, along the Akuna it was to be seen there.

(2) hagwalt'z.1m maksi'atk headdress of weasel, similar to that of la'dsx

(3) gwus maksi'atk robe of weasel worn with (2)

(4) gwusgap'hε' robe of ?

gamsne's had same crests.

: (more details on (1)) "the pole of gayeit. On that pole was the gayeit looking down, on the end of the pole was raven, under it was the frog, then ~~pt'sε'nm~~ starfish.

house

: gamsne's had a house named g.a'ym wε'.lp front painted with a raven and a long beak, with reps. of 2 human beings, and mother of pearl around the edges of the wings. (mentions 2, 3, and 4 above)

house

: algamxe's house was known as spayān a'o (the village of the frogs) all around the house, top and bottom, outside, were carved representations of the frog; also inside, around the house, top and bottom. Another term applied to the house was wu'mi'ssət g.a'n'a'o (where the frogs will spawn). In this house was a special drum [nət] with representation of raven called wu'lbe'.t kage'x "where raven is split".

On the tpu'vn there is a short fin. On the next it is much longer and sometimes down along the body, and usually has a hole. No hole in tpu'vn fin.

They are the other coasts of the laxskisk, but not the xs̄ki'vk.

Moffat: had no special crest of his own, he (used) other ganhada crests he used the ganhado in front of his house, but this also belonged to other ganhadas.

Moffat: (a) gëbe'ō painting of many wolves all over house front (exclusive). Also used as headdress.
(b) lansm̄ḡ'it wooden wolf head helmet with 8 discs above. Used in potlatches, war, and getting name.

The lansm̄ḡit was owned also by all the royal and lekakiget laxkibn

The discs on top of the hat once belonged only to the ḡispwudwads. (The wolf never belonged to the grsp) This lansm̄ḡ'it represents snags in the water, or stumps erect in the water; formerly they were sea monsters. They belonged as a crest to the ḡispwudwads ganm̄kt̄sm̄a'us : name of sea monster.

It was won in wars of the laxkibn against the ḡispwudwads, and the grsp could not pay (buy?) it back, so they lost it.

Before the war the grsp had the ganm̄kt̄sm̄a'us II and a special lansm̄ḡit I (with a white swan on top and white swan skin wrapped around between the discs) They lost II but still own I. It is used in the 10 royal ḡispwudwadahouses, not lekakiget.

I gather wolf took lansm̄ḡit, use it on wolf helmet
grsp. still have snag and white swan lansm̄ḡit.

Also other common crests.

Wallace: (i) gib̄e'ō (ḡasḡos)

Mr and Mrs Wellington (ḡispwudwadahouse)

(ii) gwus'äwe'l : robe full of arrows; he took his name from it.
