Crests of Wolf Phratry

1. q̄ib̄e's̄o Wolf

2. q̄asq. 7̄s crane

3. wil·axme'dam s̄e'mic "bear in the snow"

The bear is the grizzly, but the q̄ispwudwa'da word m̄dik ~~so~~ may not be used. The houses that use this crest form a closely related group within the laxkibū, who call each other we'ket, not just wul·e'isk :-

Royal { 1. ni·stel̄x q̄inadziks II
2. ni·slag.anos gitlen I

3. 'anaxlade' q̄itsis

and ni·skwe'ne "same house [or welsk. house?]
(same as below for q̄a'otk)

4. 5̄xne's q̄ispaxlsts

5. q̄il·axe' t̄ 7̄c·ic q̄ilodza

6. tab̄ks gitxata (but not on pole)

Only 1. and 2. could use it complete, using the whole bear skin and going inside it. The others could use it on robes, two houses, and poles.

4. wilhe'itkes̄e'mic "standing bear" (same bear as above) Used by

1. ni·stel̄x

2. ni·slag.anos

3. q̄a'otk, a subordinate of anaxlade and his brother ni·skwe'ne who had this crest before they died and then q̄a'otk took it.

4. tab̄ks gitxata

5. ni·sk̄e' q̄ib̄axtet (Not sure whether he could also use 3, but he could call those who did we'ket)

6. se'ls̄en q̄inadziks. Formerly he could use only 4, but he cared for his we'ket ni·stel̄x until his death, and there were no other heirs, so he can now also use 3.

7. Niage. e.g. ni·slasye'n of gitxadi'n.

This crest was first started at the gitxa'la village of kpeke'. meg. an used the same by all, on poles, houseposts, housefronts and robes.

(5) gwusne'-x garment of deerhoofs robe only.

1. te'baks gitxa'la
2. ni-sk'e' gitxa'la

(6) g.a'idam gibe'o or g.alk gibe'o a real wolf head worn as a headdress. The common crest of all laxkiba. All the leka'kiget may give permission for anyone in their house to use it.

(7) wil.gil.ekspe'net'su:b gibe'o "turned back the tail of the wolf" A headdress with a wolf head made of cloth or skin with a wolf tail turned back forward on the top of the head.
Common to all, like (6).

(8) ga'idam se'mic headdress of grizzly bear
(same as gispawudwa'ds g.alk madisk, under a different name). A real grizzly head is used, although the leka'kiget use only the bearskin.

This is a different crest than 3; so that
used by:

1. wesk gitsis. (got it from Cape Fox. He is not wesk to others)
 2. ni-stel'ex
 3. ni-slagano.s
- other laxkiba.

10. t'sag.a'oxta glass nose

1. ni-skwe:lno git'sis

It was a glass nose on a post at the doorway to a supernatural's house. Used on pole (a large wooden nose), on robes and housefronts.

1. 'anax lε'de git'sis.

A custom

13. xim̤'ks first snow. When the first snow fell, ni-stəlex ^{or} and ni-slagano:s had to call the people to a feast. *must be an ancient custom
